Course Description/Learning Objectives:

Art 1 is an exploratory course designed for the beginning art student. The fundamentals of pencil drawing, pen and ink, and painting are taught through demonstrations and student artwork. Other topics include color theory and design as well as processes such as printmaking, collage and mixed media. The class is project-oriented but will also incorporate art history and critiques. The course emphasizes both skills development and development of the creative thought process. All levels of skill are welcome.

Classroom Supplies Needed:

Most of the art supplies will be furnished in the classroom except students will need to acquire a sketchbook, drawing pencils and an eraser. The sketchbook should be 8.5x11 inches or a similar size with blank paper. I recommend b, 2b, 3b, 4b pencils. Erasers are a coveted item in class, so grab a few at the store.

Electronic Use Policy:

Personal electronic devices will occasionally be used to access, store, produce, research or share information during class. Other than these situations, electronic use is not allowed and devices must be put away.

Classroom/Lab Donations:

Homework Policy:

Most major projects will be completed in class. Sketchbook prompts are homework and will be posted in the classroom every Monday. These are due each Friday at the start of class.

Grading Policy: Projects 70 %, Participation 30%

All projects, homework and class participation will be graded on a point system. Students will be expected to turn in projects on the given due date. To achieve maximum points for each project the student will:

Put forth his/her best effort- students will have to show progress and improvement

Strive for original ideas on projects- be creative and be willing to take risks

Be on task every day

Clean up each day

Cooperate with teacher and peers

Come to class on time and keep absences to a minimum

Each student is given 2 points per day for participation, if they choose not to work or cleanup then they will lose those points for the day. Participation also includes appropriate use of technology in class.

Add/Drop Deadlines: The add/drop date for any class is Friday, September 13, 2019 for 1st semester. The level-down date is September 27, 2019.

Make Up Policy: Students are allowed to make up work missed for an excused absence. Office hours is an excellent time to make up work or get extra help.

Extra credit: There will be opportunities for extra credit artwork, written assignments and participation at art department events throughout the year.

Office Hours: The art room will be open during AM Office Hours. You can use this time to do homework, seek extra help, make up assignments, do research, work with other students on projects, etc. Check in using the QR code on the classroom wall.

School-wide Student Expectations

Athletic Eligibility: Student athletes must maintain a 2.0 GPA to be eligible to compete. Semester AND quarter GPAs may impact an athlete's eligibility.

Field Trips: Students planning to be out of class for a school-sponsored activity must first complete the Field Trip Permission Request process. The forms and instructions for making the request can be obtained through the activity's advisor or on the school's website (under Forms and Documents). **Please note:** students must begin circulating the Permission Request form to their teachers two weeks prior to their intended departure date.

Attendance: Students are expected to be in class everyday and on-time. If you have to miss a class, please arrange make-up work in advance with your teachers. Also: be proactive in communicating with other students in class to get information from classes on the day you missed. It is your responsibility to keep up with the class on days you miss. Clear absences with the attendance office within three days of returning to school. Refer to the discipline matrix for the consequences of habitual truancies or tardiness.

Off-grounds Passes: Students must drop off notes requesting an off-grounds pass before school if the pass is needed prior to nutrition. If the pass is needed after nutrition, students must drop off the note before the beginning of 3rd period. Any student caught off grounds without a pass will be subject to school discipline.

Short-term Independent Study: If a student must be absent from school for between 5 and 20 days, they may request consideration for short-term independent study. Independent study requires academic skills and a level of commitment, motivation, organizational skills, and self-direction not unlike the level required by college students and is not appropriate for all students. The school must assess students for their potential to be successful in the program. Students shall follow the instructions and circulate the form, Student Request for Short-Term Independent Study, to obtain teacher and counselor feedback. This form can be found under the Attendance tab on the school's website.

Student Support:

After school tutoring is available in the library from 3:00-5:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday. Guidance counselors are available for student support. Students can complete an appointment slip located in the front office and place it in their counselor's box. Counselors will call students out of class at the time listed by the student on the slip. Social-emotional supports are available in the counseling office for students. If you need to talk to an adult about an issue, challenge or problem you are facing, please approach anyone on campus who you trust.
